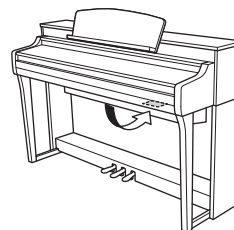

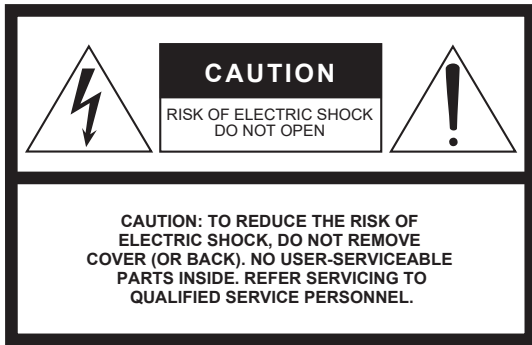

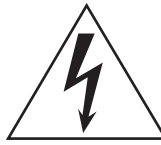

- Use only the supplied power cord/plug. Do not use the power cord/plug for other devices.
- Check the electric plug periodically and remove any dirt or dust which may have accumulated on it.

Do not open

- This instrument contains no user-serviceable parts. Do not open the instrument or attempt to disassemble or modify the internal components in any way. If it should appear to be malfunctioning, discontinue use immediately and have it inspected by qualified Yamaha service personnel.

- Do not expose the instrument to rain, use it near water or in damp or wet conditions, or place on it any containers (such as vases, bottles or glasses) containing liquids which might spill into any openings. Using the bench (If included)

Power supply/Power cord

- Do not connect the instrument to an electrical outlet using a multiple-connector. Doing so can result in lower sound quality, or possibly cause overheating in the outlet.
- When removing the electric plug from the instrument or an outlet, always hold the plug itself and not the cord. Pulling by the cord can damage it.
- Remove the electric plug from the outlet when the instrument is not to be used for extended periods of time, or during electrical storms.

Assembly (CSP-295GP/CSP-275/CSP-255)

- Assemble the instrument in the proper sequence by following the assembly instructions in this manual. Also, make sure to tighten the screws regularly. Failure to do so might result in damage to the instrument or even injury.

Location

- Do not place the instrument in an unstable position where it might accidentally fall over.
- Do not go near the instrument during an earthquake. Strong shaking during an earthquake could cause the instrument to move or tip over, resulting in damage to the instrument or its parts, and possibly causing injury.
- (CSP-295GP) Since this product is very heavy, make sure that a sufficient number of people are on hand to help, so you can lift and move it safely and easily. Attempting to lift or move the instrument by force may damage your back, result in other injury, or cause damage to the instrument itself.
- (CSP-295/CSP-275/CSP-255) When transporting or moving the instrument, always use two or more people. Attempting to lift the instrument by yourself may damage your back, result in other injury, or cause damage to the instrument itself.
- Before moving the instrument, remove all connected cables, to prevent damage to the cables or injury to anyone who might trip over them.
- When setting up the product, make sure that the AC outlet you are using is easily accessible. If some trouble or malfunction occurs, immediately turn off the power switch and disconnect the plug from the outlet. Even when the power switch is turned off, electricity is still flowing to the product at the minimum level. When you are not using the product for a long time, make sure to unplug the power cord from the wall AC outlet.

Connections

- Before connecting the instrument to other electronic components, turn off the power for all components. Before turning the power on or off for all components, set all volume levels to minimum.
- Be sure to set the volumes of all components at their minimum levels and gradually raise the volume controls while playing the instrument to set the desired listening level.

Handling

- Do not insert a finger or hand in any gaps on the key cover or instrument. Also take care that the key cover does not pinch your finger.
- Never insert or drop paper, metallic, or other objects into the gaps on the key cover, panel or keyboard. This could cause physical injury to you or others, damage to the instrument or other property, or operational failure.
- (CSP-295) Do not apply excessive force when closing the key cover. A key cover equipped with the SOFT-CLOSE™ mechanism closes the cover slowly. Applying excessive force to the key cover when closing it could damage the SOFT-CLOSE™ mechanism, and possibly result in injury to your hands and fingers caught under the closing key cover.
- Do not rest your weight on, or place heavy objects on the instrument, and do not use excessive force on the buttons, switches or connectors.
- Keep small parts out of the reach of infants. Your children may accidentally swallow them.

- Do not expose the instrument to excessive dust or vibrations, or extreme cold or heat (such as in direct sunlight, near a heater, or in a car during the day) to prevent the possibility of disfiguration, damage to the internal components or unstable operation. (Verified operating temperature range: 5° – 40°C, or 41° – 104°F)

When moving and placing the instrument

⚠ CAUTION

When moving the instrument, always hold the bottom of the instrument. Do not hold the key cover or top portion. Improper handling can result in damage to the instrument or personal injury.

NOTICE

Before moving the instrument, rotate the adjuster under the pedal until (page 21) it separates from the floor surface. Contact with the adjuster can result in damage to the floor surface. After moving, be sure to rotate the adjuster until it comes in firm contact with the floor surface.

If you move to another location, you can transport the instrument along with other belongings. Transport the instrument horizontally. Do not lean it up against a wall or stand it up on its side. Do not subject the instrument to excessive vibration or shock.

(CSP-295GP/CSP-275/CSP-255) You can move the instrument as it is (assembled) or disassembled. When transporting the assembled instrument, make sure all screws are properly tightened and have not been loosened by moving the instrument.

(CSP-295) We recommend that you place the instrument away from the wall by about 10 cm to optimize and enhance the overall sound even further.

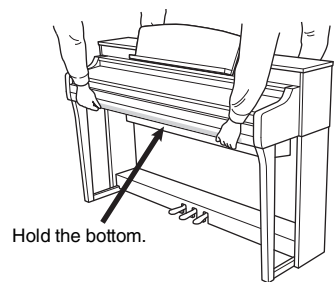

For people who have difficulty reading notation, the Stream Lights function (page 32) shows which key to play next. Just press the keys at the right time as indicated by the moving lights above the keys.

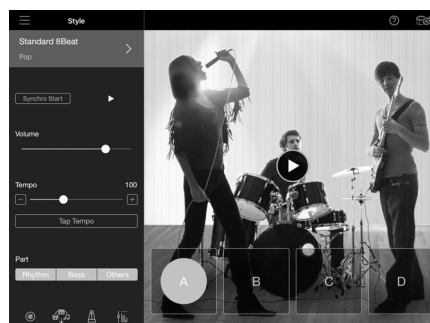
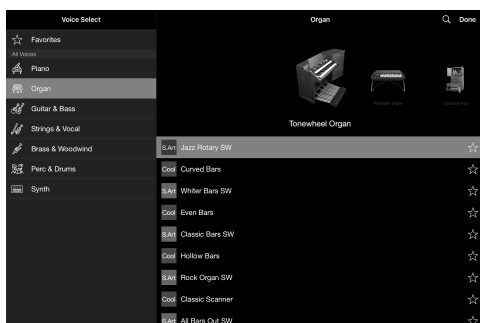

It also allows you to layer two Voices, or play different Voices in the right- and left- hand sections. Moreover, the Style function provides dynamic backing band accompaniment, even when you're playing by yourself, and features a wide number of patterns in various genres to match your performance. You can even connect a microphone and sing along with your own performance—and has luxurious harmony functions that allow you to automatically create vocal chorus backing for yourself, even when you're singing alone.



Playing with your favorite piano sound

The piano Voices have been created with samples of Yamaha's flagship CFX concert grand piano and the world renowned Bösendorfer* concert grand piano. On Smart Pianist, the Piano Room function reproduces the way sound echoes based on the environment (such as a concert hall), and the subtle changes in sound due to the opening or closing of the lid of a grand piano—letting you customize the piano sound to your exact liking.

*Bösendorfer is a subsidiary company of Yamaha.



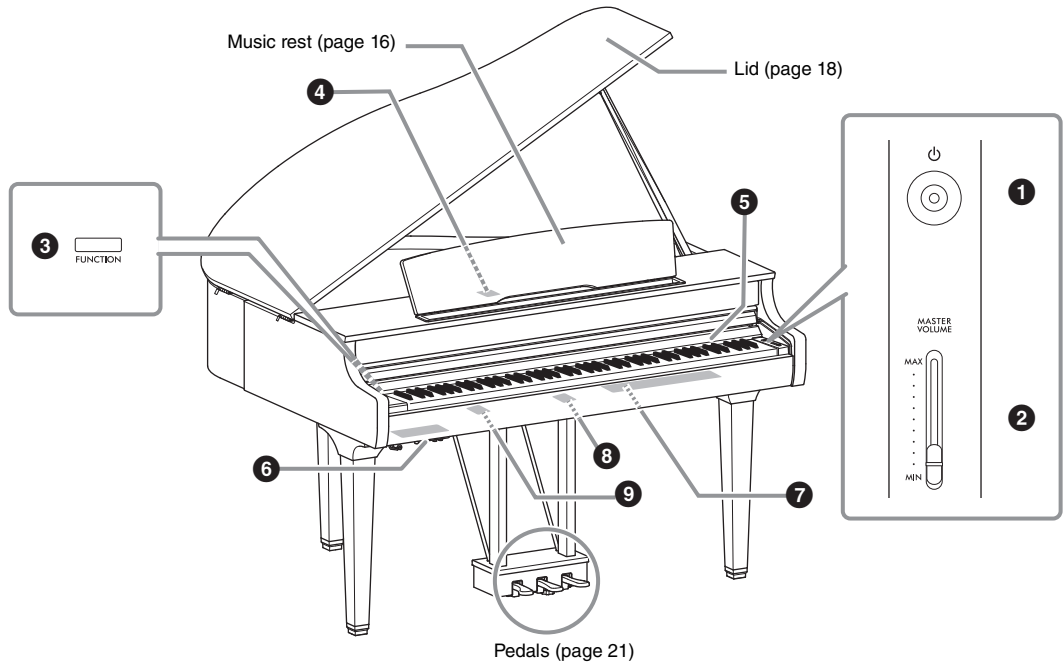
Using Smart Pianist gives you access to many more convenient and powerful functions—such as recording, adjusting volume balance among the keyboard parts/Song/Style, and transposing the pitch of the Song. See page 54 for these additional functions.

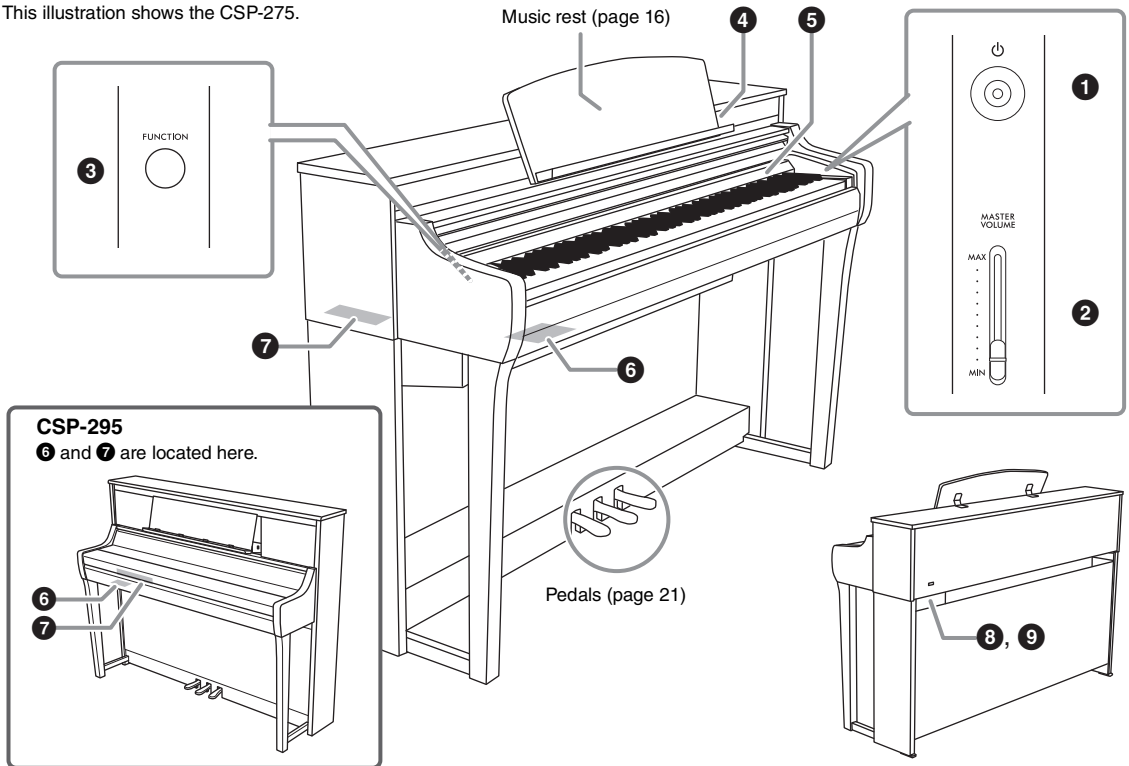

 There are four “Stream Lights” lamps embedded in the on top of each key, and these lamps light in succession in a descending pattern during Song playback to indicate the notes you should play and when you should play them.

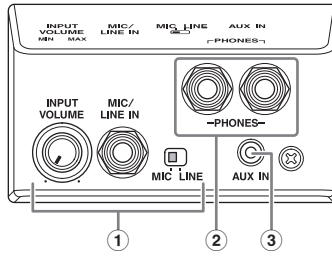

[USB-C] terminal of the CSP-295GP

When using the terminal, first raise the music rest (page 16), and then open the cover. After connecting a plug to the [USB-C] terminal, the cover can be closed by passing the USB cable through the slit on the cover. To use the smart device, place it at the front of the music rest and connect the USB cable extending out under the music rest.

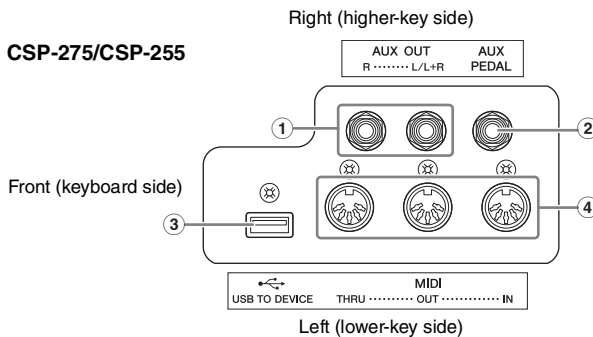

Starting Up

This section explains how to set up and start using your instrument. Setup is so simple, you can start playing right away.

Opening/Closing the key cover

CAUTION

- Hold the key cover with both hands when opening or closing it. Do not release it until it is fully opened or closed. Be careful to avoid catching fingers (yours or others, especially children's) between the cover and the unit.
- Do not place anything (such as metal objects or pieces of paper) on top of the key cover. Small objects placed on the key cover may fall inside the unit when the cover is opened and may be nearly impossible to remove. Once inside, they could cause electric shock, short circuit, fire or other serious damage to the instrument.

NOTICE

Do not rest your weight on, or place heavy objects on the instrument, especially around the key cover and the music rest. Doing so can cause damage or malfunction of the key cover.

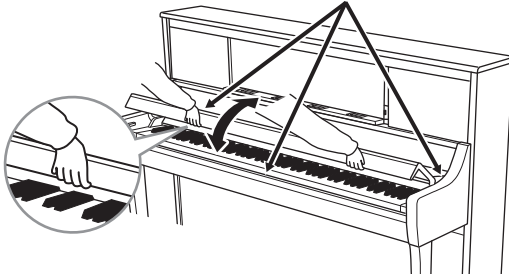
■ CSP-295

To open the key cover, lift the key cover with both hands and open it gently.

To close the key cover, pull the key cover with both hands, and lower it. The key cover is equipped with the special SOFT-CLOSE™ mechanism which closes the cover slowly.

CAUTION

Be careful to avoid catching your fingers when opening or closing the cover.



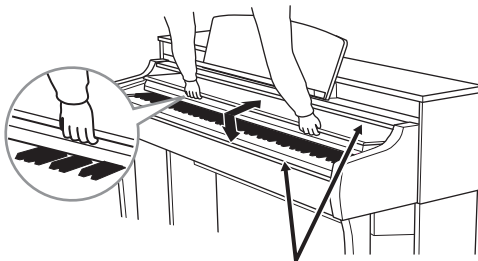
CAUTION

Do not apply excessive force when closing the key cover. Applying excessive force to the key cover when closing it could damage the SOFT-CLOSE™ mechanism, and possibly result in injury to your hands and fingers if they are caught under the closing key cover.

■ CSP-295GP/CSP-275/CSP-255

To open the key cover, lift the cover slightly with both hands, and then slide it to the end completely.

To close the key cover, slide the cover toward you with both hands, and then lower it gently.



CAUTION

Be careful to avoid catching your fingers when opening or closing the cover.

Using the music rest

You can put a smart device or music books on the music rest. The music braces on the music rest prevent the smart device from falling down or allow you to hold the pages of music books in place.

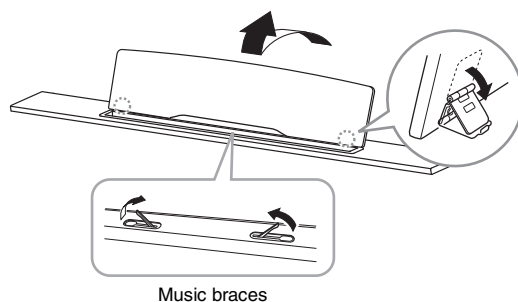
NOTICE

If you use a smart device in an unstable position, the smart device could drop from its position and result in damage. When you put a smart device on the music rest, make sure that it is fully resting against the music rest and raise the music braces to hold it in place.

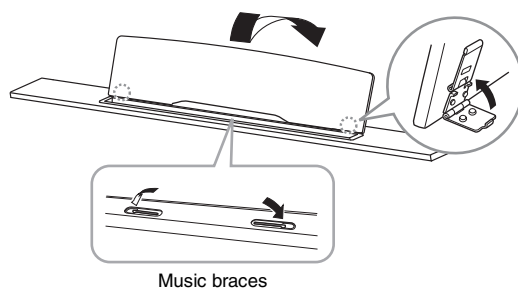
To raise the music rest:

- 1 Pull the music rest up and toward yourself as far as it will go.
- 2 Flip down the two metal supports at the left and right on the rear of the music rest.
- 3 Lower the music rest so that the metal supports latch into place.
- 4 If necessary, raise the music braces.



To lower the music rest:

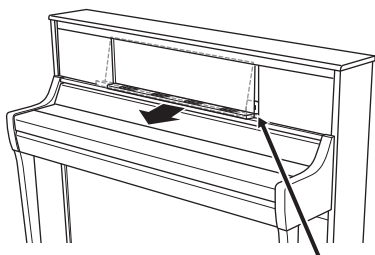
- 1 Pull the music rest toward yourself as far as it will go.
- 2 Raise the two metal supports (at the rear of the music rest).
- 3 Gently lower the music rest backward until it is all the way down.
Lower the music braces when you are not using them.



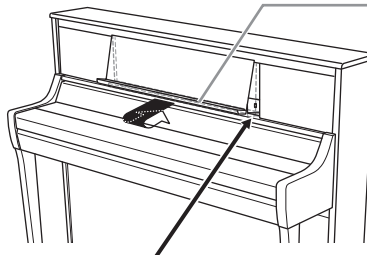

We recommend that you close the key cover to make it easier to hold the music rest.

To use the music rest, hold the bottom of the music rest, and then pull it towards yourself until it locks into place.



To put the music rest back, pull the music rest toward yourself as far as it will go, and then put it back gently.



Music braces

Raise to use.

Close after using.



CAUTION

Be careful to avoid catching your fingers when moving the music rest.

To use the music braces, raise them toward yourself as far as they will go. When you are not using them, close them back.

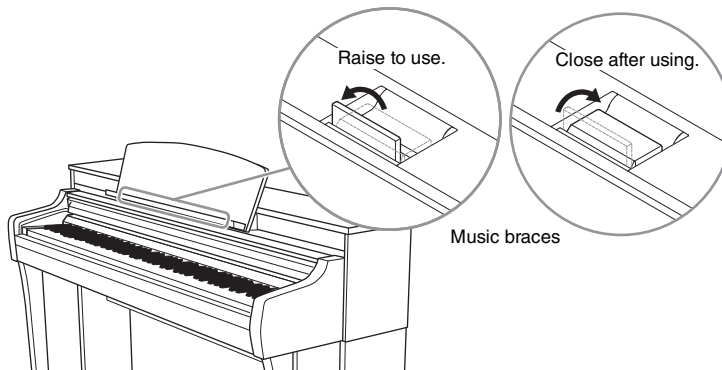

Before using the music rest, make sure that the music rest is properly attached, and the screws are tightened securely (step 8 on page 50).

⚠ CAUTION

If excessive force is applied to the music rest, the music rest and screws could loosen or break, resulting in damage or even personal injury. If the music rest becomes detached, reattach it referring to page 50. If the screws become loose, tighten them up again.

To use the music braces, raise them toward yourself as far as they will go. When you are not using them, close them back.



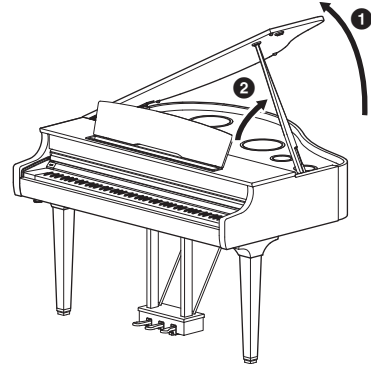
Opening/Closing the Lid (CSP-295GP)

⚠ WARNING

Do not let children open or close the lid. Also, be careful to avoid catching fingers (yours or others, and especially those of children) when raising or lowering the lid.

To open the lid:

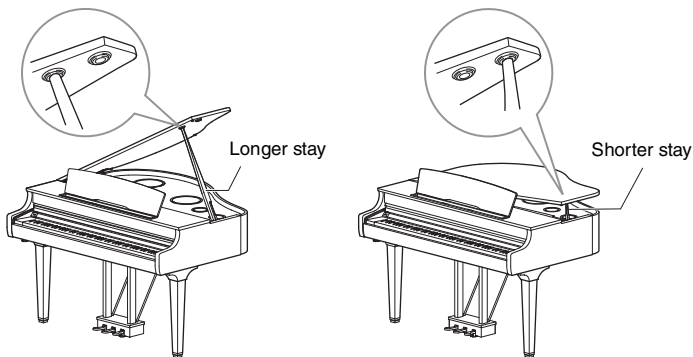
- 1 Raise and hold the right side of the lid (viewed from the keyboard end of the instrument).
- 2 Raise the lid stay and carefully lower the lid so that the end of the stay fits into the recess in the lid.



⚠ WARNING

- Make sure that the end of the stay fits securely in the lid recess. If the stay is not properly seated in the recess, the lid may fall, causing damage or injury.
- Be careful that you or others do not bump the stay while the lid is raised. The stay may be dislodged from the lid recess causing the lid to fall.

For the longer stay, use the inner recess, and for the shorter stay, use the outer recess to support the lid.

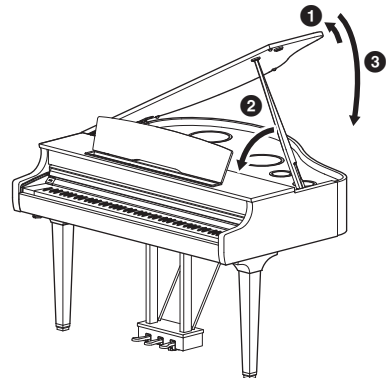


⚠ WARNING

Do not use the outer recess for the longer stay. Doing so makes the lid unstable and may cause it to fall, resulting in damage or injury.

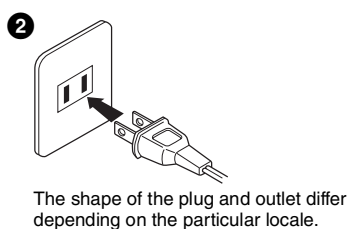
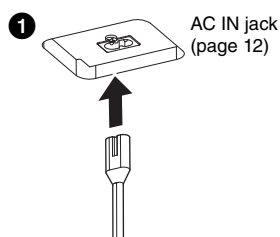
To close the lid:

- 1 Hold the lid stay and carefully raise the lid.
- 2 Hold the lid in its raised position and lower the lid stay.
- 3 Carefully lower the lid.



Power supply

Connect the plugs of the power cord in the order shown in the illustration. In some areas a plug adaptor may be provided to match the pin configuration of the AC wall outlets in your area.



⚠ WARNING

Use only the supplied power cord. Do not use the power cord for other products.

⚠ CAUTION

When setting up the product, make sure that the AC outlet you are using is easily accessible. If some trouble or malfunction occurs, immediately turn off the power switch and disconnect the plug from the outlet.

NOTE

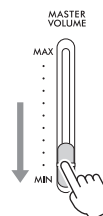
When disconnecting the power cord, first turn off the power, then follow this procedure in reverse order.

Turning the power on or off

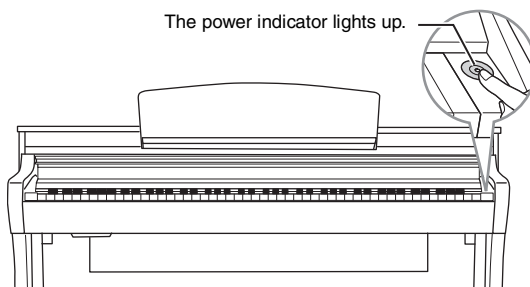
1 Turn down the [MASTER VOLUME] slider to “MIN.”

2 Press the [⏻] (Standby/On) switch to turn the power on.

The power indicator on the [⏻] (Standby/On) switch lights up. After that, the Stream Lights (page 32) located above the highest key flash a few seconds, and the instrument starts up.



The power indicator lights up.



3 After you finish using the instrument, turn off the power by pressing the [⏻] (Standby/On) switch for a second.

The power indicator on the [⏻] (Standby/On) switch is turned off.

⚠ CAUTION

Even when the [⏻] (Standby/On) switch is in standby status, electricity is still flowing to the instrument at the minimum level. Remove the electric plug from the outlet when the instrument is not to be used for extended periods of time, or during electrical storms.

NOTICE

- Do not press any keys or pedals until the instrument has completely started up (the Stream Lights stop flashing) after turning on the power. Doing so may cause malfunction.
- If you need to force-quit the instrument, hold down the [⏻] (Standby/On) switch for longer than three seconds. Keep in mind that the force-quit operation might cause data loss and damage to the instrument.

NOTE

If you want to keep other settings, use the Registration Memory on Smart Pianist.

What is Grand Expression Modeling?

On an actual acoustic piano, subtle changes in the sound can be produced by changing your playing touch from when you press a key to when you release it. For example, when you press a key all the way to its bottom, the key hits the keybed underneath and the noise reaches the strings, changing the sound slightly. Furthermore, the tone when the damper is lowered onto strings to mute the sound is changed by how quickly you release the key. The Grand Expression Modeling technology recreates these subtle changes in the sound that respond to your touch. This allows you to add accents by playing strongly or add resonance by playing softly to produce superbly expressive sound. A crisp tone can be heard when playing staccato as well as a lingering sound produced when releasing the keys slowly.

On this instrument, Grand Expression Modeling is effective only for the Voices of “CFX Grand” and “Bösendorfer.”

Auto Power Off function

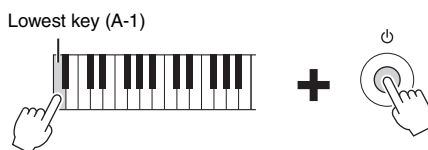
To prevent unnecessary power consumption, this instrument features an Auto Power Off function that automatically turns the power off if the instrument is not operated for a specified period of time. The amount of time that elapses before the power is automatically turned off is approximately 30 minutes by default; however, you can change the setting from [Utility] → [System] on Smart Pianist.

NOTICE

Any data which are not saved will be lost if the power automatically turns off.

Disabling Auto Power Off (simple method)

Turn the power on while holding down the lowest key on the keyboard. The instrument starts up with the Auto Power Off function disabled.



NOTE

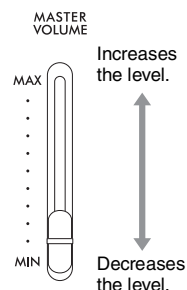
You can enable/disable the Auto Power Off function by using the [FUNCTION] button (page 30).

Adjusting the Master Volume

To adjust the volume, use the [MASTER VOLUME] slider located at the right of the panel. Play the keyboard to check the sound while you adjust the volume.

CAUTION

Do not use the instrument at a high volume level for a long period of time, or your hearing may be damaged.



Intelligent Acoustic Control (IAC)

IAC is a function which automatically adjusts and controls the sound quality according to the overall volume of the instrument. Even when playing the instrument with the overall volume turned down, it permits both low sounds and high sounds to be clearly heard. IAC is effective only from the sound output of the instrument speakers. This function is set to on by default; however, you can turn it on or off, and set the depth from [Utility] → [Sound Setting] on Smart Pianist.

Using the pedals

This instrument is equipped with three foot pedals. Before using the instrument, rotate the adjuster under the pedal until it comes in firm contact with the floor surface so that the pedal box does not rattle or give way when you step on the pedals.

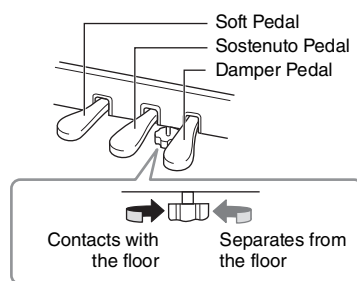
By default, the following functions are assigned to each pedal. You can also assign other functions such as “Style Start/Stop” to the pedals from [Utility] → [Pedal Setting] on Smart Pianist.

NOTICE

When moving the instrument, rotate the adjuster until it separates from the floor surface.

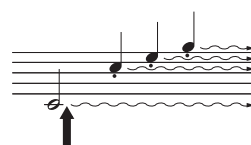
NOTE

The pedals are protected with vinyl covers when shipped from the factory. Remove the covers from the pedals before using to ensure optimum use of the pedal effects.



Damper pedal (right pedal)

When you press the damper pedal, the notes you play have a longer sustain. Pressing this pedal while you play a VRM Voice (page 23) recreates the characteristic string resonance of a real acoustic piano. You can use the Half-pedal function with this pedal.



When you press the damper pedal here, the notes you play before you release the pedal have a longer sustain.

Half-pedal function

The Half-pedal function allows you to use half-damper techniques, in which the damper is pressed somewhere between all the way down and all the way up. In this half-damper state (on a real piano), the damper felts only partially mute the strings. This function lets you delicately and expressively control the damper muting, and create subtle nuances in your performance, by finely controlling the point at which pressure on the pedal affects the damper muting. The point is called “Half Pedal Point” and can be set in the [Piano Room] or [Utility] → [Pedal Setting] on Smart Pianist.

GP Response Damper (CSP-295GP/CSP-295 only)

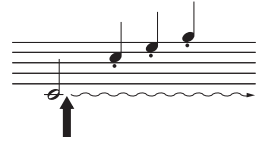
The damper pedal of the CSP-295GP/CSP-295 has been designed to provide enhanced tactile response and, when pressed, is much closer in feel to the pedal of an actual grand piano. It makes it easier to physically experience the half-pedal point and more easily apply the half-pedal effect than other pedals.

Sostenuto pedal (center pedal)

If you play a note or chord on the keyboard and press the sostenuto pedal while holding the note(s), the notes will sustain as long as the pedal is held. All subsequent notes will not sustain.

NOTE

While the sostenuto (center) pedal is held, a sustained (non-decaying) type of Voice such as organ or strings may sound continuously without decay after the notes have been released.



When you press the sostenuto pedal here while holding the note(s), the notes will sustain as long as you hold the pedal.

Soft pedal (left pedal)

The soft pedal reduces the volume and slightly changes the timbre of notes played while the pedal is pressed. The soft pedal will not affect notes that are already playing when it is pressed.

NOTE

When a Voice other than piano (such as Jazz Organ) is selected, a specific function appropriate for the Voice is automatically assigned to the left pedal.

Using headphones

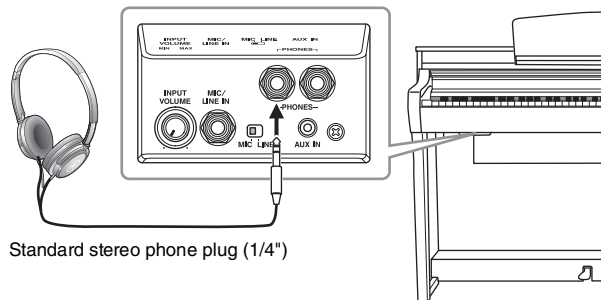
Connect a pair of headphones to the [PHONES] jacks. Since this instrument is equipped with two [PHONES] jacks, you can connect two pairs of headphones. If you are using only one pair, insert the plug into either of these jacks.

CAUTION

Do not use the headphones for a long period of time at a high or uncomfortable volume level, since this can cause permanent hearing loss.

NOTE

When a plug is connected to the [PHONES] jack, no sound will come out from the instrument's speakers. If you are using an adaptor plug, be sure to remove this as well when unplugging the headphones.



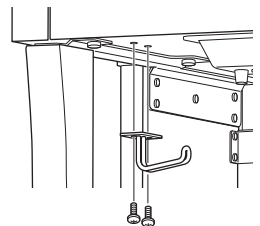
Standard stereo phone plug (1/4")

Using the headphone hanger

A headphone hanger is included in the instrument package so that you can hang the headphones on the instrument. Attach the headphone hanger by using the included two screws (4 × 10 mm) at the left front side as shown in the illustration.

NOTICE

Do not hang anything other than the headphones on the hanger. Otherwise, the instrument or the hanger may be damaged.



Reproducing the natural sensation of sound distance (even when using headphones)

This instrument features two advanced technologies that allow you to enjoy exceptionally realistic, natural sound, even when listening on headphones.

■ **Binaural Sampling**

Binaural Sampling is a method that uses two special microphones set at the ear position of a performer and records the sound from a piano as it would actually be heard. Listening to the sound with this effect through headphones gives the impression of being immersed in the sound, as if it was actually emanating from the piano. Moreover, you can enjoy the sound naturally for a long time without ear fatigue. When the “CFX Grand” or “Bösendorfer” (page 30) is selected, connecting the headphones automatically enables the binaural sampling sound.

Sampling

A technology which records the sounds of an acoustic instrument and then stores them to the tone generator to be played based on information received from the keyboard.

■ **Stereophonic Optimizer**

Stereophonic Optimizer is an effect which reproduces the natural sound distance, like with the sound of Binaural Sampling, even though you are listening to it on headphones. When one of the VRM Voices other than “CFX Grand” or “Bösendorfer” is selected, connecting the headphones automatically enables the Stereophonic Optimizer.

To see which Voices are VRM Voices, refer to the Data List on the website.

What is VRM?

On an actual acoustic piano, if you press the damper pedal and play a key, not only does the string of the pressed key vibrate, it also causes other strings and the soundboard to vibrate, each influencing the rest and creating a rich and brilliant resonance that sustains and spreads. The VRM (Virtual Resonance Modeling) technology featured in this instrument reproduces the complicated interaction of both string and soundboard resonance faithfully using a virtual musical instrument (physical modeling), and makes the sound more like a real acoustic piano. Since instantaneous resonance is made at the moment according to the state of the keyboard or pedal, you can vary the sound expressively by changing the timing of your pressing the keys, and the timing and depth of your pressing the pedal.

Playing with Smart Pianist

You can take greater advantage of this instrument and get even more enjoyment from it by connecting it to your smart device such as a smartphone or tablet, and using the Smart Pianist smart device app. Smart Pianist gives you convenient and powerful access to additional functions, such as recording and Registration Memory. Moreover, the display gives you exceptionally intuitive visual control, making it even easier to control the instrument.

NOTE

To see what you can do on the instrument by itself, or by using the Smart Pianist, refer to the list on page 54.

Connecting with Smart Pianist

This instrument can be connected to a smart device wirelessly (page 27) or via a cable (page 28). For instructions on connecting the instrument with a smart device, the “Connection Wizard” of Smart Pianist will guide you according to the condition of the instrument you are using. If you want to connect via Bluetooth, read “Bluetooth connection” on page 25 beforehand, and then go on to the instructions below.

NOTICE

- All settings on the instrument are replaced by the settings on Smart Pianist when the instrument is connected with Smart Pianist.
- Do not place the smart device in an unstable position. Doing so may cause the device to fall and result in damage.



- 1 On Smart Pianist, tap the [≡] icon located at the upper left on the display to open the menu.
- 2 Tap [Instrument] to call up the Connection display.
- 3 Tap [Start Connection Wizard] at the bottom.
- 4 Follow the Connection Wizard.

When the connection is done successfully, the model name of the instrument such as “CSP-295” is shown next to [Instrument] located at the lower left on the display. After completing the connection, use Smart Pianist to control the instrument. While Smart Pianist is connected to the instrument, playing the keyboard is the only operation that can be done on the instrument.

Disconnecting Smart Pianist

If you close Smart Pianist on the smart device, the instrument is disconnected from the app. Pressing the [FUNCTION] button on the instrument can also disconnect the instrument from the app. Even if Smart Pianist is disconnected, you can use the instrument with the settings you've made on the app maintained until the power of the instrument is turned off.

■ To reconnect with Smart Pianist:

On the menu of Smart Pianist, tap [Instrument] to call up the Connection display (steps 1 – 2 on page 24), and then select the model name (such as CSP-295). If the model name is not shown in the Connection display, start the Connection Wizard again.

Connecting wirelessly

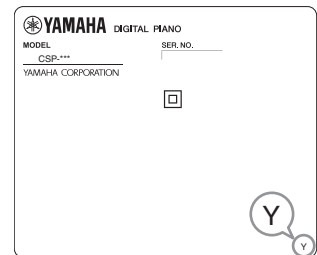
Connect the instrument with a smart device via Bluetooth (see below) or Wi-Fi (page 27).

Bluetooth connection

When connecting via Bluetooth, first make the Bluetooth Audio function settings on the instrument to enable receiving Audio data. After that, use Smart Pianist to connect via Bluetooth MIDI for transmitting/receiving MIDI data. Before using the Bluetooth function, be sure to read “About Bluetooth” on page 7.

Bluetooth capability

Depending on the country in which you purchased the product, the instrument may not have Bluetooth capability. If a “Y” indication is printed on the lower-right corner of the name plate at the bottom, the instrument does not have Bluetooth capability.



■ Bluetooth Audio connection (Bluetooth Audio function)

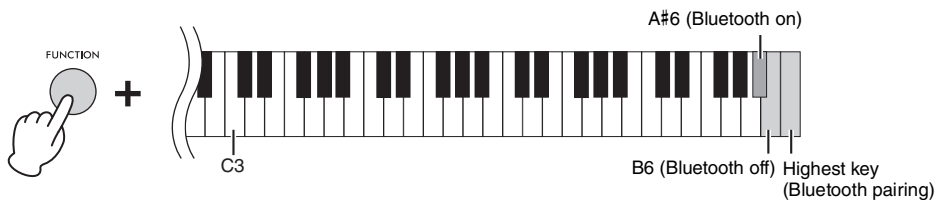
This section explains how to receive audio data from a Bluetooth-equipped device, such as a smartphone. When a Bluetooth-equipped device is connected, you can listen to the sound of audio data played on the connected device through the built-in speakers of the instrument.



NOTE

- In this manual, “Bluetooth-equipped device” refers to a device that can transmit audio data on it to the instrument using the Bluetooth function, via wireless communication. For proper operation, the device must be compatible with A2DP (Advanced Audio Distribution Profile). The Bluetooth Audio function is explained here by using a smart device as an example of such Bluetooth-equipped devices.
- This instrument cannot transmit audio data to the Bluetooth-equipped devices via Bluetooth. Thus, when the device is connected by Bluetooth, you cannot record in audio format by using Smart Pianist. If you want to record while Bluetooth connection, record in MIDI format. You can record in audio format when the instrument is connected to the smart device in a method other than Bluetooth.

- 1 While holding down the [FUNCTION] button, press the highest key (C7) to pair with a smart device.



The Stream Lights (blue) of the right-most black key flash in succession downward while pairing. To cancel the pairing, press the [FUNCTION] button.

NOTE

- “Pairing” means to register Bluetooth-equipped devices on this instrument, and establish the mutual recognition for wireless communication between the two.
- The Bluetooth function of the instrument should be on to start pairing. It is set to on by default. To turn the Bluetooth function on/off, press the A#6 key or B6 key while holding down the [FUNCTION] button.
- Only one Bluetooth-equipped device can be connected to this instrument at a time (although up to 8 devices can be paired to this instrument). When pairing with the 9th device has succeeded, pairing data for the device with the oldest connection date will be deleted.

- 2 On the smart device, set the Bluetooth function to on and select “CSP-*** (model name) AUDIO” from the connection list.

After pairing is completed, the Stream Lights (blue) of the right-most black key flash for about three seconds.

If the Stream Lights do not flash, turn off the Bluetooth function by pressing the B6 key while holding down the [FUNCTION] button. After that, turn on the Bluetooth function by pressing the A#6 key while holding down the [FUNCTION] button, and then try the procedures from step 1 again.

NOTE

- Make sure to complete the settings on the smart device within 5 minutes.
- If you are prompted to enter a passkey, enter the numerals “0000.”

- 3 Play back audio data on the smart device to confirm that the built-in speakers of the instrument can output the audio sound.

When you turn on the instrument the next time, the last-connected smart device will be connected to this instrument automatically, if the Bluetooth function of the smart device and the instrument is set to on. If it is not connected automatically, select the model name of the instrument from the connection list on the smart device.

■ **Bluetooth MIDI connection**

To connect to a smart device via Bluetooth MIDI, follow the guide of the Connection Wizard on Smart Pianist (steps 1 – 4 on page 24). From the connection list, select “CSP-*** (model name) MIDI.”

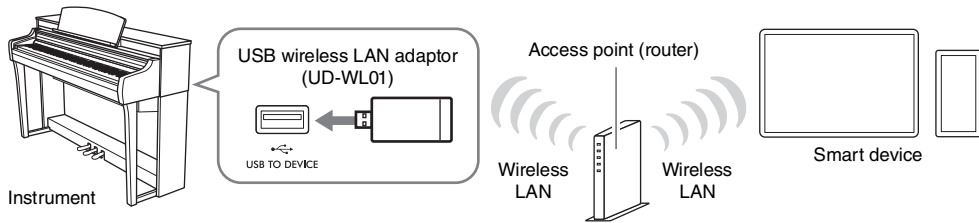


NOTE

The Bluetooth function of the instrument should be on for the connection. It is set to on by default. To turn the Bluetooth function on/off, press the A#6 key or B6 key while holding down the [FUNCTION] button (step 1 on above).

Wi-Fi (Wireless LAN) connection

For Wi-Fi connection, you need a separately sold wireless LAN adaptor (UD-WL01). Before connecting the wireless LAN adaptor, be sure to read “Precautions when using the [USB TO DEVICE] terminal” below.



NOTICE

Do not connect this product to a public Wi-Fi and/or Internet service directly. Only connect this product to the Internet through a router with strong password protections. Consult your router manufacturer for information on optimum security practices.

NOTE

The instrument can be connected via Wi-Fi directly without need of an access point. However, in this condition Internet access will be disabled on your smart device, and certain functions may be limited, such as mailing, searching and some functions of Smart Pianist.

Stream Lights behavior when connecting by WPS

While setting up using an access point that supports WPS connection by Wi-Fi, the Stream Lights (blue) of the left-most black key flash in succession downward.

If the connection is completed, the four Stream Lights flash for about three seconds all together, and you can check the connection on Smart Pianist. If the connection fails, the Stream Lights do not flash.

WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup)

WPS refers to structure to easily make settings of a wireless LAN, just by pressing the WPS button. This helps you save time and effort in making the settings necessary for connecting to a network.

Precautions when using the [USB TO DEVICE] terminal

This instrument features a built-in [USB TO DEVICE] terminal. When connecting a USB device to the terminal, be sure to handle the USB device with care. Follow the important precautions below.

NOTE

For more information about the handling of USB devices, refer to the owner's manual of the USB device.

Compatible USB devices

- USB wireless LAN adaptor (UD-WL01; sold separately)
- USB flash drive (can only be used to update the software; not for use in saving files, reading data, recording nor playing back)

Other USB devices such as a USB hub, computer keyboard or mouse cannot be used.

NOTICE

The rating of the [USB TO DEVICE] terminal is a maximum of 5V/500mA. Do not connect USB devices having a rating above this, since this can cause damage to the instrument itself.

Connecting a USB device

When connecting a USB device to the [USB TO DEVICE] terminal, make sure that the connector on the device is appropriate and that it is connected in the proper direction.

NOTICE

- Avoid connecting or disconnecting the USB device when accessing the USB device. Failure to observe this may result in “freezing” of the operation of the instrument or corruption of the USB device and the data.
- When connecting and then disconnecting the USB device (and vice versa), make sure to wait a few seconds between the two operations.
- Do not use an extension cable when connecting a USB device.

Connecting via cables

Connect the smart device to the [USB-C] terminal by using a USB cable. Make sure that the USB cable has appropriate connectors (and an appropriate USB conversion adaptor, if necessary).

On the CSP-295GP, the [USB-C] terminal is located at the rear of the music rest; on the other models, it is located at the right end of the music rest. The device connected to this terminal is automatically charged during use.

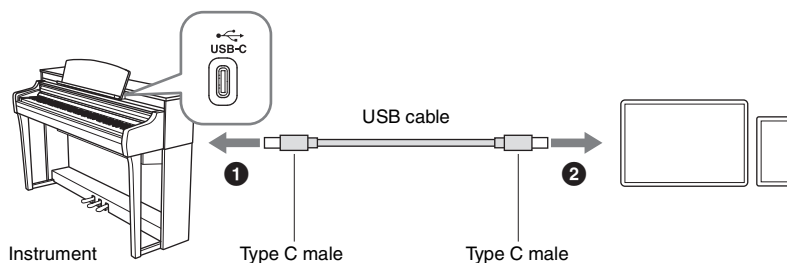
NOTE

(CSP-295GP) For more information on the [USB-C] terminal, refer to page 13.

(CSP-295) When connecting or disconnecting a cable, we recommend that you pull the music rest toward yourself and hold it for easier access to the jack.

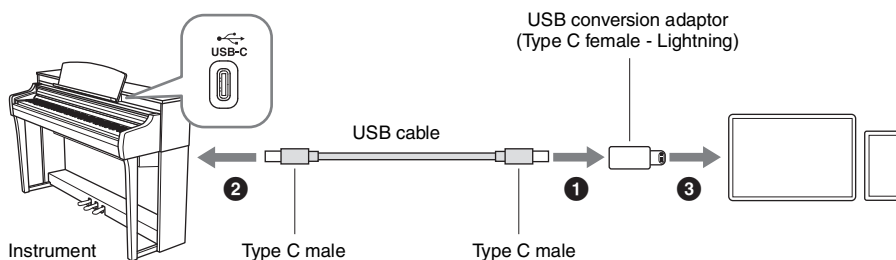
■ USB Type C connector devices

Connect a USB cable (Type C male - Type C male) in the order shown in the illustration.



■ Lightning connector devices

Connect a USB cable (Type C male - Type C male) and a USB conversion adaptor (Type C female - Lightning) in the order shown in the illustration.



You can also simply use just an Apple USB-C to Lightning cable for the connection.

NOTICE

When using a USB-C to Lightning cable, use a genuine Apple cable.

NOTE

If you disconnect the cable from the smart device's connector and reconnect it, Smart Pianist may not be properly connected. If this happens, disconnect the cable from the [USB-C] terminal of the instrument and connect it again, or turn the power of the instrument off and turn it on again.

Precautions when using the [USB-C] terminal

When connecting a smart device or a computer to the [USB-C] terminal, make sure to observe the following points to avoid freezing the smart device, computer or instrument, and corrupting or losing the data.

NOTICE

- Use a CC type or AC type (page 39) USB cable of less than 3 meters. USB 3.0 cables cannot be used.
- Execute the following before turning the power to the instrument on/off or plugging/unplugging the USB cable to/from the [USB-C] terminal.
 - Quit any open app on the smart device.
 - Make sure that data is not being transmitted from the instrument. (Data is transmitted even when the notes on the keyboard are played or a Song is played back.)
- While the smart device is connected to the instrument, you should wait for six seconds or more between these operations: (1) when turning the power of the instrument off then on again, or (2) when alternately connecting/disconnecting the USB cable.

If the smart device, computer or instrument freezes, restart the app or the smart device/computer, or turn the power to the instrument off then on again.

Playing the Instrument Stand-alone

This chapter explains about the functions that can be controlled by using this instrument alone (without Smart Pianist). When the instrument is connected with Smart Pianist, you cannot control by using the instrument. Disconnect the instrument from Smart Pianist (page 25) to control by the instrument.

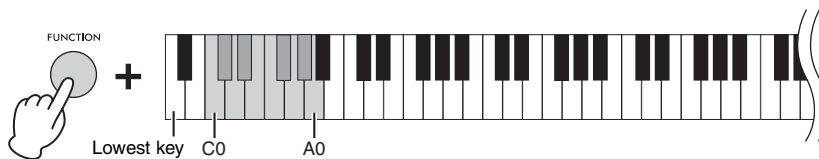

Playing with various sounds (Voices)

You can play the keyboard by using various instrumental Voices. While holding down the [FUNCTION] button, press one of the C0 – A0 keys to select the desired Voice (page 30). To reset to the default Voice (CFX Grand), press the [FUNCTION] button.



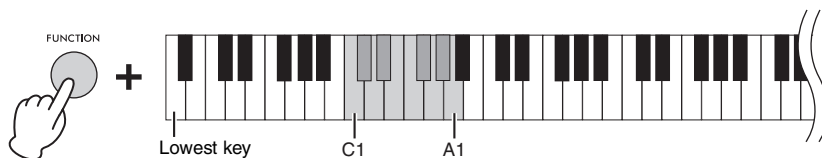
NOTE

If you use Smart Pianist, the Voices can be played via three keyboard parts: Main, Layer and Left. These playing modes allow you to play just one single Voice (Main part) over the entire keyboard, layer a different Voice (Layer part) to the Main part, or play a different Voice in the left-hand areas of the keyboard by turning the Left part on. When the Left part is turned on, the Stream Lights lights up at the point (called Split Point) which divides the keyboard into the left-hand and right-hand areas.

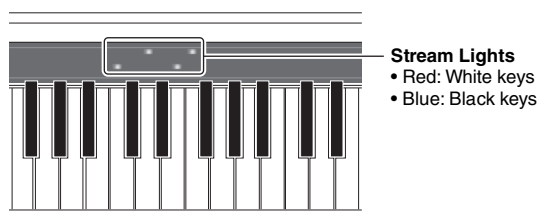
Playing back a Song

This section explains how to play the preset Songs (page 31).

- 1 While holding down the [FUNCTION] button, press one of the C1 – A1 keys.



During Song playback, the Stream Lights indicate the notes you should play and when you play them. As the lights “descend,” play the indicated key when the light reaches the bottom, nearest the key.



The Stream Lights speed and the on/off status can be set from [Song] → (Song select) → [Setting] → [Playback] on Smart Pianist.

NOTE

To change the tempo, refer to page 34.

- 2 Press the [FUNCTION] button to stop playback.

The ten preset Songs are played back continuously until you stop playback.

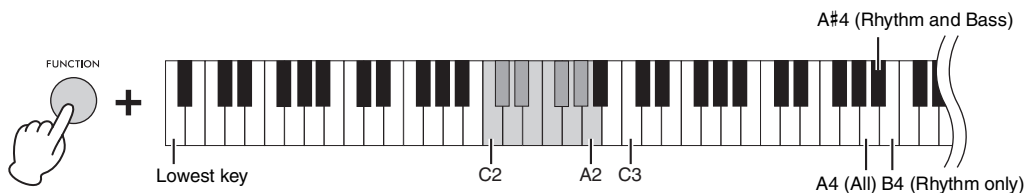
NOTE

You can use the Guide function on Smart Pianist. When it is turned on, you can practice at your own pace — since the playback of other parts will wait for you to play the notes correctly.

Playing with a Style

This instrument features “Styles” that produce automatic accompaniment playback in response to your playing of the keyboard.

- 1 While holding down the [FUNCTION] button, press one of the C2 – A2 keys.**
The rhythm part of the selected Style (page 31) starts playback.



NOTE

To adjust the tempo, refer to page 34.

- 2 Play the keyboard along with the rhythm part.**

As soon as you play a key, the bass part and other parts start playing. Just by playing the keyboard, the instrument detects the chords and automatically plays the accompaniment along with your performance.

A Style consists of rhythm, bass and other parts. All these parts are played back by default, but you can specify the parts to be played. While holding down the [FUNCTION] button, press one of the A4 – B4 keys.

NOTE

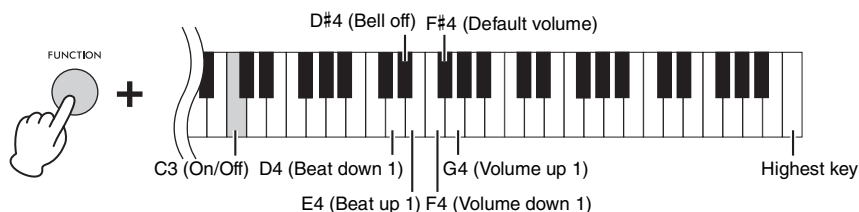
If you set the Chord Detection Area to “Lower” by using Smart Pianist, a specifically assigned left-hand section of the keyboard is used to specify chords, and chords played in this section are detected and used as a basis for automatic accompaniment with the selected Style. To restore the default setting, select “Full” as the Chord Detection Area.

- 3 After you have finished the performance, press the [FUNCTION] button to stop playback.**

An ending plays back before the Style stops.

Using the Metronome

By using the metronome, you can practice with an accurate tempo, and confirm the actual tempo by hearing it. While holding down the [FUNCTION] button, press the C3 key to turn on/off the metronome. You can also stop the metronome while it is playing back by simply pressing the [FUNCTION] button.



■ To adjust the volume

The volume can be adjusted over a range of 0 – 127. While holding down the [FUNCTION] button, press the F4 or G4 key. To reset to the default volume (100), simultaneously hold down the [FUNCTION] button and press the F#4 key.

■ To change the beat

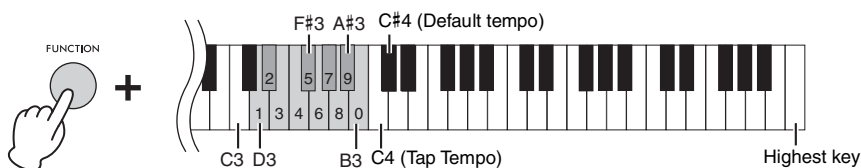
The beat can be selected from 0, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6. The first beat is accented with a bell sound and the rest with clicks. By default, it is set to 0 (Bell off) and clicks sound in all beats. While holding down the [FUNCTION] button, press the E4 or D4 key to change the beat up or down. To reset to the default, simultaneously hold down the [FUNCTION] button and press the D#4 key.

NOTE

To adjust the tempo, see below.

Adjusting the tempo

You can adjust the tempo of the Songs, Styles or metronome over a range of 5 – 500 beats per minute.



■ By inputting a three-digit value

While holding down the [FUNCTION] button, press the appropriate D3 – B3 keys one by one in order. For example, to specify “95,” while holding down the [FUNCTION] button, press the B3 (0), A#3 (9) and F#3 (5) keys in order.

■ By tapping at the desired tempo (Tap Tempo)

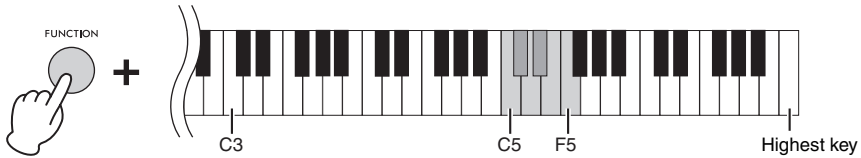
While holding down the [FUNCTION] button, tap the C4 key (twice or more) at the desired tempo to change the tempo.

To reset to the default tempo, simultaneously hold down the [FUNCTION] button and press the C#4 key. The default tempo differs depending on the selected Song or Style.

Selecting the Reverb type

An actual piano sounds differently depending on the room in which it is played. You can select the Reverb type which simulate the reverberation in the different rooms.

While holding down the [FUNCTION] button, press one of the C5 – F5 keys to select the Reverb type. The selected Reverb is applied to all the entire sound including the keyboard performance, Song/Style playback and MIDI playback input from an external MIDI device.



Reverb Type List

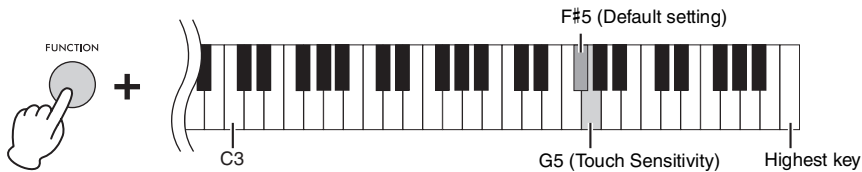

NOTE

When a Style or Song is selected, the ideal Reverb type is automatically called up. For this reason, a type may be called up that is not available from the types above.

Setting the Touch Sensitivity of the keyboard

Touch Sensitivity determines how the sound responds to your playing strength. This setting does not change the weight of the keyboard. Simultaneously hold down the [FUNCTION] button and press the G5 key to toggle among the various settings: Medium, Hard 1, Hard 2, Fixed, Soft 2, Soft 1 and Medium. To reset to the default setting (Medium), simultaneously hold down the [FUNCTION] button and press the F#5 key.



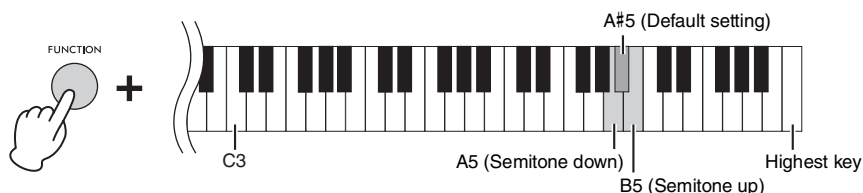
Touch Sensitivity List

Touch Sensitivity	Description
Soft 2	Produces relatively high volume even with light playing strength.
Soft 1	Produces high volume with moderate playing strength.
Medium	Standard Touch Sensitivity.

Fixed	The volume level will be the same regardless of how hard you play the keys.

Transposing the pitch in semitones

You can shift the pitch of the entire keyboard up or down in semitones in order to facilitate playing in difficult key signatures, or to easily match the pitch of the keyboard to the range of a singer or other instruments.

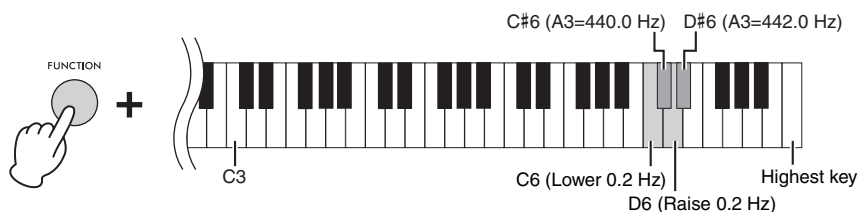
While holding down the [FUNCTION] button, press the A5 or B5 key to shift the pitch up or down over a range of -12 – +12. To restore the default setting (normal pitch = 0), simultaneously hold down the [FUNCTION] button and press the A#5 key.



Fine-tuning the pitch

You can fine-tune the pitch of the entire instrument in approximately 0.2 Hz steps. This lets you accurately match the keyboard pitch to that of other instruments or recorded music.

While holding down the [FUNCTION] button, press the C6 or D6 key to raise or lower the pitch over a range of 414.8 – 466.8 Hz (=A3).



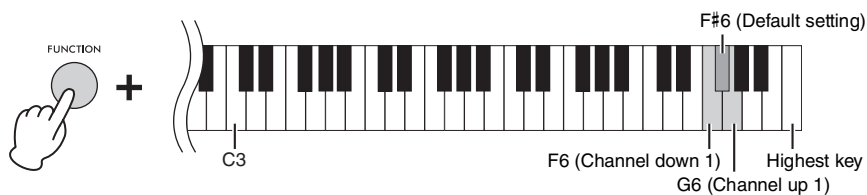
To set the pitch to 442.0 Hz (a pitch commonly used by brass and wind instruments), simultaneously hold down the [FUNCTION] button and press the D#6 key. To restore the default pitch (440.0 Hz), simultaneously hold down the [FUNCTION] button and press the C#6 key.

Changing the MIDI transmit channel


You can change the MIDI channel for transmitting MIDI messages of your keyboard performance from the MIDI [OUT] terminal to a connected MIDI device. The three keyboard parts are changed in conjunction. The default settings are as follows:

- Main part: MIDI port 1, channel 1
- Layer part: MIDI port 1, channel 2
- Left part: MIDI port 1, channel 3

While holding down the [FUNCTION] button, press the F6 or G6 key to change the channels up or down by one. To restore the default settings, simultaneously hold down the [FUNCTION] button and press the F#6 key.



Example

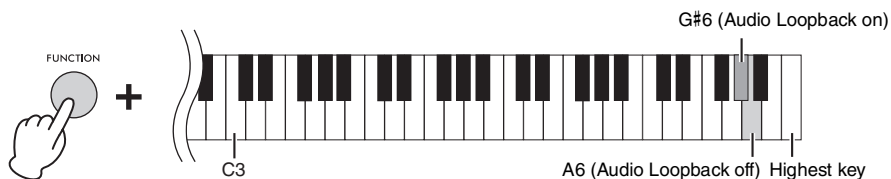
NOTE

The channel of the Main part is the basis and can be changed over a range of 1 to 8. When the Main part's channel is 8, pressing "Channel up 1" (press the G6 key while holding down the [FUNCTION] button) does not change the channels of all three parts. When the Left part's channel is 8 (Main part is 6), pressing "Channel up 1" restores the Left part's channel to 1.

Turning Audio Loopback on/off

The Audio Loopback function allows you to set whether audio input sound from the smart device or computer is output to a smart device or a computer or not along with the performance played on the instrument. To output the audio input sound, set the Audio Loopback to on. For example, if you want to record the audio input sound as well as the sound played on the instrument by using the connected computer or smart device, set this to on. If you intend to record only the sound played on the instrument by using the computer or smart device, set this to off.

To turn this function on/off, simultaneously hold down the [FUNCTION] button and press the G#6 or A6 key.

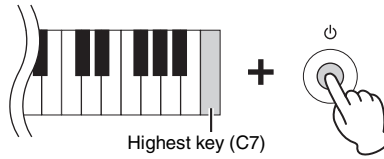


NOTE

- The audio input sound via the Bluetooth Audio function (page 25), USB Audio Interface function (page 40) or the Wi-Fi connection with Smart Pianist (page 27) can be output. The sound is output to the smart device or the computer connected via the USB Audio Interface function or Smart Pianist connected via Wi-Fi. The sound cannot be output to a Bluetooth device.
- When Audio Recording by using Smart Pianist, the audio input sound from the connected smart device or computer is recorded when this is set to on, and not recorded when set to off.

Resetting to the Factory-programmed Settings (Initializing)

Turn off the power once, and then simultaneously hold down the C7 (the highest) key and press the [⏻] (Standby/On) switch to turn on the power. This resets (or initializes) all of the settings (page 20) to their factory default, with the exceptions of Each Key Setting (page 20) and Bluetooth pairing information (page 26).



Connections

External devices can be connected to the jacks and terminals on this instrument. For information on the location of these connectors, refer to “Panel Controls and Terminals” on page 12. You can also connect a Bluetooth-equipped device, such as an audio player, by using the Bluetooth function*.

*For information on whether Bluetooth functionality is included or not, refer to page 25.

CAUTION

Before connecting the instrument to other electronic components, turn off the power of all the components. Also, before turning any components on or off, make sure to set all volume levels to minimum (0). Otherwise, damage to the components, electrical shock, or even permanent hearing loss may occur.

NOTICE

Do not place any external devices in an unstable position. Doing so may cause the device to fall and result in damage.

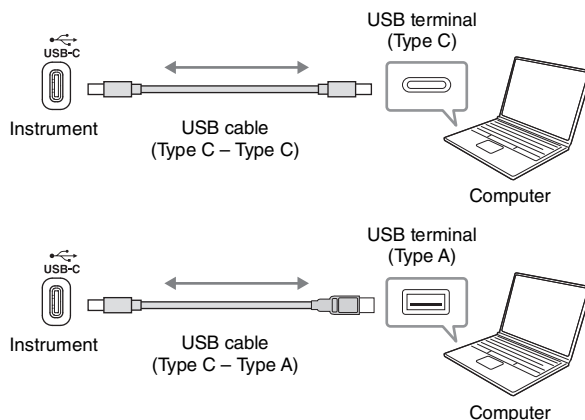
Listening to Audio data from a Bluetooth-equipped device through this instrument (Bluetooth Audio Function)

This instrument is equipped with the Bluetooth Audio function. You can play the sound of audio data saved in a Bluetooth-equipped device, such as a smartphone or portable audio player, on this instrument and listen to it through the built-in speaker of the instrument. For details, refer to page 25.

Connecting to a computer — [USB-C] terminal

By connecting a computer to the [USB-C] terminal, audio data or MIDI data can be transmitted/received between the instrument and the computer.

To connect via the [USB-C] terminal, use a USB cable with the proper connectors as shown below. Before using the [USB-C] terminal, be sure to read “Precautions when using the [USB-C] terminal” on page 29.



NOTE

- When using a USB cable to connect the instrument to your computer, make the connection directly without passing through a USB hub.
- The instrument will begin transmission a short time after the USB connection is made.
- Unexpected sounds may occur if you edit MIDI data related to the Grand Expression Modeling effect (page 20) on a computer.

Transmitting/Receiving Audio Data (USB Audio Interface function)

By connecting a computer or a smart device to the [USB-C] terminal via a USB cable, digital audio data can be transmitted/received. This USB Audio Interface function provides the following advantages:

■ Playing back audio data with high sound quality

This gives you direct, clear sound in which the sound quality has less noise and deterioration than that from the [AUX IN] jack.

■ Recording your performance on the instrument as audio data by using recording software or music production software

The recorded audio data can be played back on the computer or smart device.

⚠ CAUTION

If you are using a DAW (digital audio workstation) application with this instrument, set the Audio Loopback function (page 37) to off. Otherwise, a loud sound may occur, depending on the settings of the computer or the application software.

NOTE

- When transmitting or receiving audio signals by using a computer running Windows, the Yamaha Steinberg USB Driver should be installed to the computer. Download the driver from Yamaha Downloads (page 8) and install it to the computer.
- For instructions on connecting a smart device, see "Connecting via cables" on page 28 first, and then go on to the steps on page 24.

Turning Audio Loopback On/Off

You can set whether audio input sound from the computer or smart device is output to a computer or a smart device or not along with the performance played on the instrument. For details, refer to page 37.

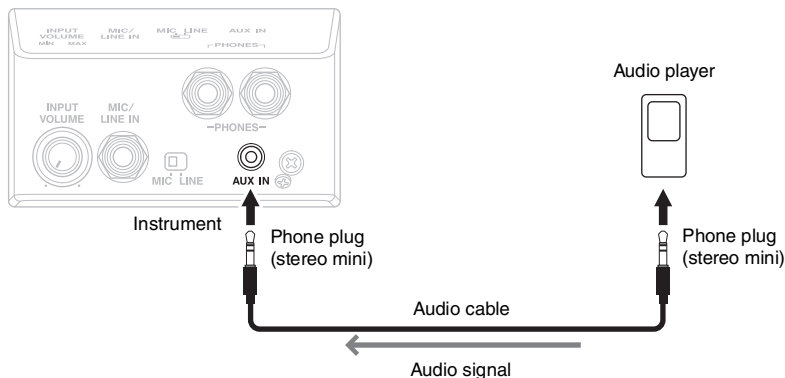
Connecting to an external audio device — [AUX IN] jack, AUX OUT [R]/[L/L+R] jacks

Listening to playback on an audio player through the instrument's speaker

You can connect the headphone jack of an audio player, such as a smartphone or portable audio player to the instrument's [AUX IN] jack, and listen to the sound of that audio player through the built-in speakers of the instrument.

NOTICE

To avoid damage to the devices, first turn on the power to the external device, and then to the instrument. When turning off the power, do in reverse: first turn off the power to the instrument, and then to the external device.



NOTE

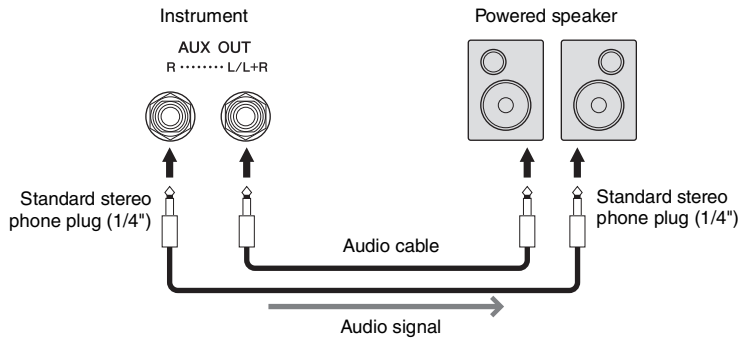
- Use audio cables and adaptor plugs having no (zero) resistance.
- The USB Audio Interface function (see above) gives you direct, clear sound in which the sound quality has less noise and deterioration than that from the [AUX IN] jack.

Using an external stereo system for listening to sounds from the instrument

You can connect a stereo system to amplify the instrument's sound by using the AUX OUT [R]/[L/L+R] jacks. The sound input from the [AUX IN] jack and the [MIC/LINE IN] jack is output at the same time.

NOTICE

- To avoid possible damage, first turn on the power to the instrument, and then to the external device. When turning off the power, do in reverse: first turn off the power to the external device, and then to the instrument.
- Since this instrument's power may automatically be turned off due to the Auto Power Off function (page 20), turn off the power to the external device, or disable Auto Power Off when you do not intend to operate the instrument.
- Do not route the output from the AUX OUT jacks to the [AUX IN] jack. If you make this connection, the signal input at the [AUX IN] jack is output from the AUX OUT jacks. These connections could result in a feedback loop that will make normal performance impossible, and may even damage the equipment.

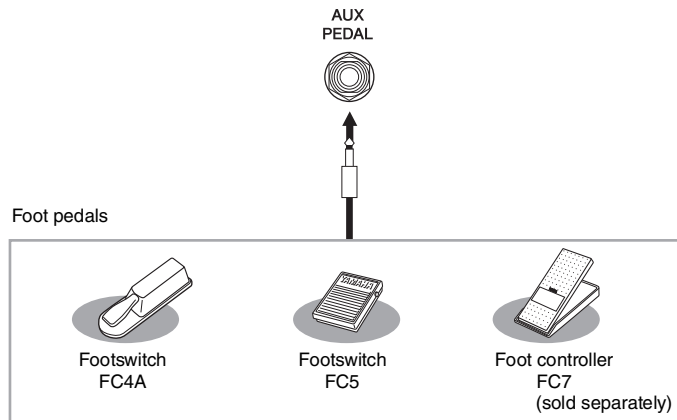


NOTE

- When connecting a mono device, use only the [L/L+R] jack.
- Use an appropriate adaptor plug if the input jack of the powered speaker does not match the phone plug of the audio cable.
- Use audio cables and adaptor plugs having no (zero) resistance.
- When you are monitoring the sound output via the AUX OUT jacks from headphones connected to the instrument, we recommend that you set the Binaural Sampling and Stereophonic Optimizer functions (page 23) to off. These can be turned on or off from [Utility] → [Sound Setting] → [Binaural] on Smart Pianist.

Connecting a footswitch/foot controller — [AUX PEDAL] jack

The FC4A/FC5 footswitch or the FC7 foot controller (sold separately) can be connected to [AUX PEDAL] jack. A footswitch can be used for switching functions on and off, while a foot controller controls continuous parameters such as volume. The function of the connected pedal can be set from [Utility] → [Pedal Setting] on Smart Pianist.



NOTE

- Make sure to connect or disconnect the pedal only when the power is off.
- Do not press the pedal while turning the power on. Doing this changes the recognized polarity of the pedal, resulting in reversed operation.

Connecting a microphone or guitar — [MIC/LINE IN] jack

The [MIC/LINE IN] jack (standard 1/4" phone jack) lets you connect a microphone, guitar, or other audio equipment.

- 1 **Before turning on the power of the instrument, set the [INPUT VOLUME] knob to the minimum position.**
- 2 **Connect the microphone or the guitar to the [MIC/LINE IN] jack.**

NOTE

Make sure you have a conventional dynamic microphone.

- 3 **Set the [MIC/LINE] switch to “MIC” or “LINE,” depending on the instrument to be connected.**

- **MIC:** For connecting an equipment with low output level (such as a microphone, guitar, bass)
- **LINE:** For connecting an equipment with high output level (such as a synthesizer, keyboard, CD player)

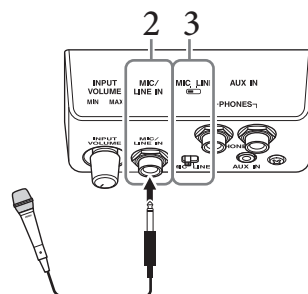
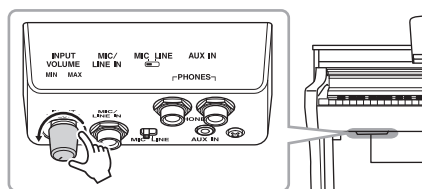
- 4 **Turn on the power of the instrument.**

- 5 **Adjust the [INPUT VOLUME] knob while singing into the microphone or playing the guitar.**

The microphone related settings such as Harmony and Reverb can be made from [Utility] → [Mic Setting] on Smart Pianist.

Disconnecting the microphone/guitar

Set the [INPUT VOLUME] knob to the minimum position, and then disconnect the microphone/guitar from the [MIC/LINE IN] jack.



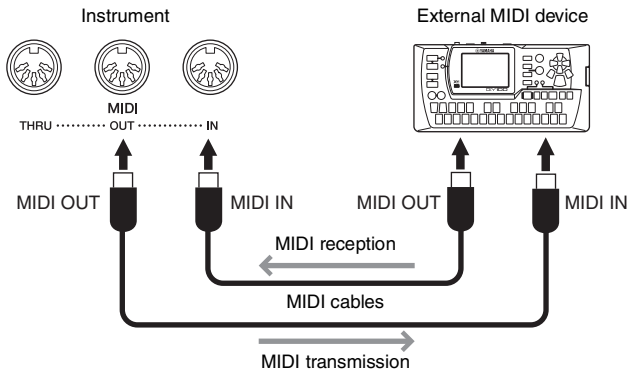
Connecting external MIDI devices — MIDI terminals

Use the MIDI terminals and standard MIDI cables to connect external MIDI devices (keyboard, sequencer, etc.).

MIDI [IN]: Receives MIDI messages from another MIDI device.

MIDI [OUT]: Transmits MIDI messages generated by the instrument to another MIDI device.
